The 2023-2024 election cycle was another pivotal election for our country. There were many challenges we had to overcome as an industry and many opportunities for growth. Supply chain and the workforce shortage continue to be some of our biggest hurdles but, the implementation of record investment made into this Nation's infrastructure has given our industry and NECA contractors a unique opportunity.



NECA's Government Affairs team advocated for us on Capitol Hill and with the administration to make sure our businesses were protected and considered with each piece of legislation and new regulation that came their way.

During the 118th Congress, our team advocated for several key legislative initiatives, including the Tax Relief for American Families and Workers Act, which passed the House with strong bipartisan support.

Additionally, NECA pushed for the final passage of the Federal Aviation Administration and Water Resources Act Reauthorization bills to ensure more work opportunities for us contractors. They also strongly endorsed and advocated for the permitting reform package introduced in the Senate by Senators Barrasso and Manchin.

I'm proud to share that NECAPAC continues to be the leading specialty trade construction PAC in the country, investing nearly \$1.8 million in 174 candidates in the U.S. Senate and U.S. House of Representatives. We did this with a 94% win rate, showing our investments were made wisely.

Because of your support, NECAPAC was able to aid in the success of some of our closest allies to ensure our voices are heard and issues are considered in the 119th Congress. For the first time ever, we were even able to get a NECA contractor elected to Congress. This is a huge milestone for our industry and our advocacy efforts.

I want to thank you all for supporting NECAPAC. It has been an honor to serve as your 2021-2024 PLC National Chairman and I look forward to seeing the success that NECAPAC brings to our industry for years to come.

## **NECA's Impact on the 118th Congress**

The National Electrical Contractors Association (NECA) is the nationally recognized voice of the electrical construction industry. NECA's represents over 4,000 contractors who bring electrical power, lighting, and communications systems to homes, buildings, and communities across the United States. For over 120 years, NECA has worked to advance legislation and regulatory policies that promote its member's opportunities and ability to operate efficiently, profitably and in the best interest of their customers.

**Legislative Wins:** NECA's Government Affairs team was able to achieve significant wins in the 118<sup>th</sup> Congress, including billions in infrastructure funding, progress on permitting reform, groundwork for tax reform, and electing a NECA contractor to Congress.

- Passage of the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA), National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA), Water Resources Development Act (WRDA) reauthorizations with NECA recommendations.
- Tax Relief for American Families and Workers Act, which passed the House with bipartisan support and supported a Senate permitting reform package.

Largest Legislative Gathering of Industry Professionals: In May 2024, NECA hosted over 150 contractors and industry professionals from 26 states for the NECA Legislative Conference.

 Key issues like tax reform and permitting were discussed, culminating in 164 Capitol Hill visits and a congressional reception.

**Regulatory Achievements:** NECA achieved significant regulatory successes in 2024, impacting the electrical contracting industry.

- National Electric Vehicle Infrastructure (NEVI) Rule: Through NECA's efforts, \$50 million in grants were allocated for EV chargers, promoting sustainable transportation infrastructure across the nation.
- Registered Apprenticeships: NECA collaborated with the Department of Labor to advocate for grants that support public-private partnerships. These initiatives are designed to expand, diversify, and strengthen Registered Apprenticeships, providing a skilled workforce for the electrical industry.

**Regulatory Comments:** NECA actively engaged in the regulatory process by submitting comments on several key regulations, including:

- National Apprenticeship System Enhancements:
   Ensuring that apprenticeship programs are effective and aligned with industry needs.
- Clean Energy for New Federal Buildings and Major Renovations: Advocating for standards that promote sustainability in federal construction projects.
- Apprenticeship and Prevailing Wage Bonus under the Inflation Reduction Act (IRA): Supporting measures that incentivize apprenticeship programs and ensure fair wages.

Looking Ahead to the 119th Congress: On January 3, 2025, Congress opened a new session amidst a politically charged atmosphere. Republicans hold a narrow majority in the House and a more secure one in the Senate, setting the stage for intense political negotiations and potential power shifts with swing votes.


NECA sent a letter to all 535 Congressional offices urging action on key issues vital to the electrical contracting industry:

- Secure Prosperity Through Tax Reform: NECA urges
   Congress to make permanent the pass-through
   deduction for S-Corporations, repeal the estate tax, and
   expand research & development expensing.
- Invest in Our Nation's Infrastructure: Congress should continue to invest in our nation's infrastructure by fully funding the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act and the CHIPS and Science Act and work to enact a new Highway & Transit Reauthorization bill.
- Greenlight Growth with Permitting Reform: The
  National Environmental Policy Act and Clean Water Act
  processes take an average of seven years for approval.
  Congress should enact permitting reform measures to
  speed up project approvals.
- Building the Workforce That Powers America:
   Congress should back private-sector registered
   apprenticeship programs for future electricians and
   oppose any changes to the Davis-Bacon Act or limit the
   use of project labor agreements.
- Procurement Reform: Deliver Faster, Smarter. Small businesses are the backbone of the economy. Congress should improve the change order process and lower federal retainage rates, as these commonsense solutions should have strong bipartisan support.




